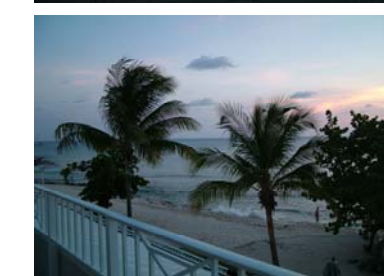
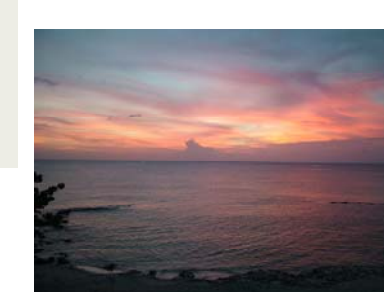
When we were there in July, the iguanas were molting – shedding last year’s skin for new bright blue skin. We have lots of pictures of some of the most beautiful flowers anywhere.

Great Places to Eat & Drink on Grand Cayman

We had a blast on Grand Cayman. This year we came back with the Taylors – the couple we traveled with to Grand Cayman in 2006.

We wanted to experience some new restaurants – and we were not disappointed.

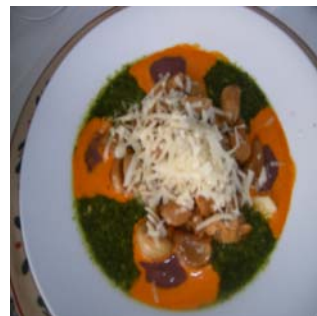
The Cracked Conch (pronounced Conk) was our choice for a Sunday Bruch. See our video on Facebook ([CaymanIsBest](#) Group) which shows the buffet.

Suffice to say we ate very well and enjoyed conch fritters as well as turtle and conch stew.

About half way up the east side of the island is the Lighthouse Restaurant. We’ve enjoyed an afternoon appetizer before and went back for lunch on this trip.

This is well worth the driving time. I had fresh snapper, perfectly prepared along with a fresh grouper cheviche. Eating out on the screened in porch can be a little warm in summer, but the food is excellent.

The third place to showcase is the Reef Grill at Royal Palms. This is on Seven Mile Beach, just up from the Hyatt Beach Suites. During the day it is a



beach bar, but at night, the upstairs transforms into an incredible gourmet restaurant. Seated by the owner’s daughter, you can’t go wrong.
